At the time we had discovered 'Virtual Regatta' and sailing the Volvo Ocean Race. On the other hand having taken pleasure from virtual racing, started surfing the internet to find an alternative, I found myself in the 'Sydney Hobart' race! This program can expand your knowledge of navigation, offers the possibility of racing in virtual world while you do your strategic planning. It carries you to a 'deckman' like environment with weather reports received from USGrib and the right to put about 20 waypoints using the polar diagrams of your boat.

By working on the polar diagram you can compete in a very realistic environment... reinforce your knowledge of VMG, offers you to work on scenarios that you can encounter in real life offshore races, and its free.

welcome to Sailonline Yacht Club. I would recommend you to be a member. Although membership is optional if you like to race and control your boat over the phone you have to be a member. Annual membership fee is Euro 25. However, you can compete without becoming a member. 1000 people compete in races and very exciting races can take place.

Individual ranking system has been established at SYC as well as country rankings are done occasionally.

While writing for the February 2009 issue, we were a total of eight Turks racing, after the article in Naviga others joined the group and we are now more than 40 people. With the growing Turkish interest even the Turkish chat page opened. What makes us happy here is the fact that friends who have no connection to sailing started to enjoy and learn sailing. We became a special group by transfering our knowledge to them. We established a ranking system among Turks and the first trophy was won by Ahmet Çullu. The prize, which was a Bottle of Chivas Regal whiskey was presented to him!

Besides all, last year we had a dream to introduce a Turkey race into this environment!
